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# DIRECTOR'S NOTES:

A good portion of my relatives live in Florida so I try to get back there every couple of years. Last spring I went to Tallahassee to see a play I had never heard of: "Vanya And Sonia And Masha And Spike." It had several things against it: the playwright is not one of my favorites; instead of a main-stage production, it was done in the lobby of the theater, with a raised platform along one wall, entrances and exits through the audience; and, according to their web site, the play was born out of three of Chekhov's most famous plays. I like Chekhov, just not in large doses.

In just a few minutes, we were all in hysterics. You don't have to know anything about Chekhov to enjoy the humor. It was one of the very best plays I saw on my trip – and I see plays 3 or 4 nights a week.

As I was driving back to my hotel after seeing it, I realized that the incidental music in the play was really good, like another cast member. When I requested the license to perform the play, I found out why it was so special: the music from the original Broadway production was available to rent with the script. We have never done that before. At the first rehearsal with the Broadway music, I could see that I was right.

It hasn't been all fun and games. A month into rehearsals, the actress playing Sonia had a death in her family that made it impossible to continue in the role. Lisa Spesard, a newcomer to Actors Theater and our Assistant Stage Manager, was cast in the role and given just 2-1/2 weeks to learn all the lines. She has done a wonderful job, bringing energy and sparkle to her scenes. One of the best parts of directing community theater is the way that everyone in the cast and crew comes together when there is a problem. We all miss our original Sonia, but we all appreciate the hard work Lisa has put into becoming our new Sonia.

Enjoy yourself, and appreciate all the hours the cast and crew have put into making this a wonderful show.
